


























Coins

A good coin collection has more value than the sum of its individual coins.

Place five of each coin—pennies, nickels, dimes, quarters, and dollars—into the grid so that the five pennies fall on unique letters from A-E, as do the five nickels, and so on. The rows and columns must add up to the indicated amounts. The chart at the bottom is simply to help you keep track of placed coins.
