


Mnemosyne sought stories in every part of the four far flung corner of the world (of Greece, that is). All in the service of your task: Bend the paper's corners backwards. Angles on the back (which align with corners) bear important information. Copy curves and lines to make, from the fragments, a sentence of four small words. That's your hole card. Good luck!

Step 1: Bend the corners back and copy the letter fragments into the boxes to spell the four words.

- Step 2: Read every fourth word of the original instructions.
- Step 3: Poke a hole in the angles on the back with curved letter pieces next to them, then read the letters in the boxes on the front that have holes poked into them.
