









### Let's split up, gang










# My glasses! I can't see without my glasses!










### Danger-Prone Daphne did it again!






Each blank needs a six-letter word. Nine of the words have common elements. The other six words, they have common elements, too. Once that's discovered, then dash along the path to connect the dots.









### Would you do it for a Scooby Snack?
