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Eros, the god of love, has shown up at a speed-dating session. Each person at this speed-dating session is assigned a **number**. Eros used his arrows to make each person fall in love with someone on the other side. Eros is mischievous: he caused everyone to fall in love with one person, everyone to be loved by one person, but no one's love to be reciprocated.




Eros has many arrows, but only five different arrowheads; each arrowhead does something different. Additionally, Eros may shoot up to three arrows **from** each person to get the job done, even repeating a type if required.

Can you figure out who fell in love with whom?

Possible arrowhead effects:

- Add the number of letters in the person's name
- Divide by 3
- Multiply by 2
- Subtract 2
- Subtract 5



This year, Theseus, King Aegeus's son, volunteers to be one of the sacrifices. Theseus plans to kill the Minotaur, but he's having trouble finding it within the complex maze where it is imprisoned. Can you help him?

- Theseus took a path that wound through all 9 regions of the maze.
- Theseus never walked over a space that he had already been on.
- The maze is a 3 by 3 grid. Cut out the pieces to assemble. Tape may be helpful.







Echos

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BONUS: PERSEUS AND MEDUSA

- There can be no more than one statue per space
