All of the words can be divided into sets of 4 by different categories. But in each of these sets, three of the items fit into a second category to which the fourth does not.

The words that fit only the first category all start with a different letter from A-M. Arranging the words in this order and taking the fourth letter spells "ALL OF LINE FOUR". The answer to the puzzle is the entire fourth line of the poem.

ANSWER: I WAS SO SURE I'D WIN IT.
