

Forsaken





We' recently discovered two groups of helpless victims, isolated for so long that they forgot their own names. If we <u>figure out where they stand</u> and give them back their names, we might be able to get them back.

Each victim is trapped in a cage specially made to fit them and their names. Most victims' cages are made for their first names, but some require their full names or titles as indicated. The good news is, the cages seem to have a weak point. We're not sure where each point is, but we've figured out the following rules:

- There is only one weak point per row, per column, and per cage.
- The weak points are never adjacent to each other, even diagonally.

Once you've worked out where the weak points are, make sure you know which names go in each cage. Names are filled in left to right, top to bottom. We're certain that if you combine the weak points with the victims' names, we can figure out how to get them out!
